#### STUDENT VOTER REGISTRATION

Thank you to Anice Mills and Kimberly Morella for organizing the spring voter registration drives. LWVNEW volunteers Maura Rosenthal and Diane Weingarten registered new voters at John Jay High School on Friday, April 25. A week later, on May 2, Anice Mills and Lisa Pizzurro were on hand at Fox Lane High School to register students there.

Spring registrations are typically slower than those in the fall and that was the case again this year. We had 13 completed registrations at John Jay and 5 at Fox Lane, for a total of 18; additionally, seven students took blank forms with them. The advantage of leaving completed forms with us is that we take them all down to the Board of Elections in White Plains and hand them in on the students' behalf.

Student voter registration is quick, easy, and enjoyable; the kids are great and some of them are so demonstrably excited about registering to vote. ### **NEW YORK STATE PRIMARY**

Looking ahead, the date of New York State's primary election is Tuesday, June 24. Early Voting will be available from Saturday, June 14 to Sunday, June 22. As always, we will have the Early Voting polling places and schedule on our website at <a href="https://www.LWVNEW.org/elections-voting">www.LWVNEW.org/elections-voting</a>.

There will be a congressional primary election in our area. The League of Women Voters of Westchester usually handles congressional candidate forums and we will keep you posted on any arrangements that are made. As of this newsletter, we don't know of any.

The deadline to register to vote in time for the primary is June 14. (A reminder that New York has a closed primary system; to vote in a political party's primary, you must be a member of that party.)

### LWV WESTCHESTER ANNUAL MEETING/CONVENTION

LWVNEW is allotted 3 voting delegates for the meeting, which will be followed by a buffet supper and speaker: Spencer Reynolds, Senior Counsel in the Brennan Center for Justice's Liberty & National Security Program. The topic sounds interesting: Protecting Liberty & Security and Bolstering Checks & Balances.

Delegates will sign up and pay there as well, once we have confirmed with them that they are attending in that capacity. Again, we will reimburse voting delegates the \$50.

SIA is sponsored by the League of Women Voters of New York State Education Foundation, Inc. The program is designed to increase students' awareness of their responsibility in representative government and provide the tools necessary for meeting that responsibility. The interactive conference brings together high school students from across the state to learn about New York's government and the process by which citizens can participate in the policy making arena. As part of this program, students will tour the Capitol and observe both the Senate and Assembly in action by spending

an afternoon shadowing their legislator.
