EARLY VOTING

The previously announced Early Voting location for Lewisboro and Pound Ridge residents has been changed by the Board of Elections. The new location is the Pound Ridge Town House. Please see the revised Information:

EARLY VOTING LOCATIONS:

- --Bedford, Mt Kisco (& New Castle) voters: Mount Kisco Town Hall, 104 Main St., Mount Kisco
- --Lewisboro & Pound Ridge voters: Pound Ridge Town House, 179 Westchester Ave, Pound Ridge*
- --North Salem (& Somers) voters: Somers Town House, 335 Route 202, Somers
- *The Board of Elections is 99% certain this will be the location for Lewisboro & Pound Ridge voters. Check back with the BOE before early voting, to ensure this location is correct & final: (914) 995-5700

Election Day is Tuesday, November 5. The arrival of Early Voting to New York State does not impact voters planning to vote on Election Day. If voting on November 5th, go to your regular polling place and vote as you always have. Polls are open from 6 am until 9 pm.

- --October 11: Last day to postmark voter registration form or register in person at Board of Elections (BOE)
- --October 26: Early voting is available through November 3
- --October 29: Last day to postmark application for absentee ballot
- --November 3: Early voting ends
- --November 4: Last day to apply in person for absentee ballot
- --November 4: Last day to postmark ballot for general election
- --November 5: Last day to deliver absentee ballot in person to BOE
