The NYS Assembly has submitted two constitutional amendments for public vote. One allows for no-excuse absentee voting; the other overrides the 10-day voter registration deadline in New York's

constitution. Both amendments passed in the Senate, so they will now appear as a referendum on November ballots.

REDISTRICTING COMMISSION FUNDING FINALLY RELEASED

With Redistricting Commission funding finally released, commission members are expected to vote on their official budget and bylaws at their next meeting.

The commission also discussed the proposed public hearing schedule. Although the commission originally planned to start holding hearings as early as June, it is now more likely that hearings will start in July. Unfortunately, even with funds available, there are a lot of logistics that must be decided before the hearings can officially be scheduled.
